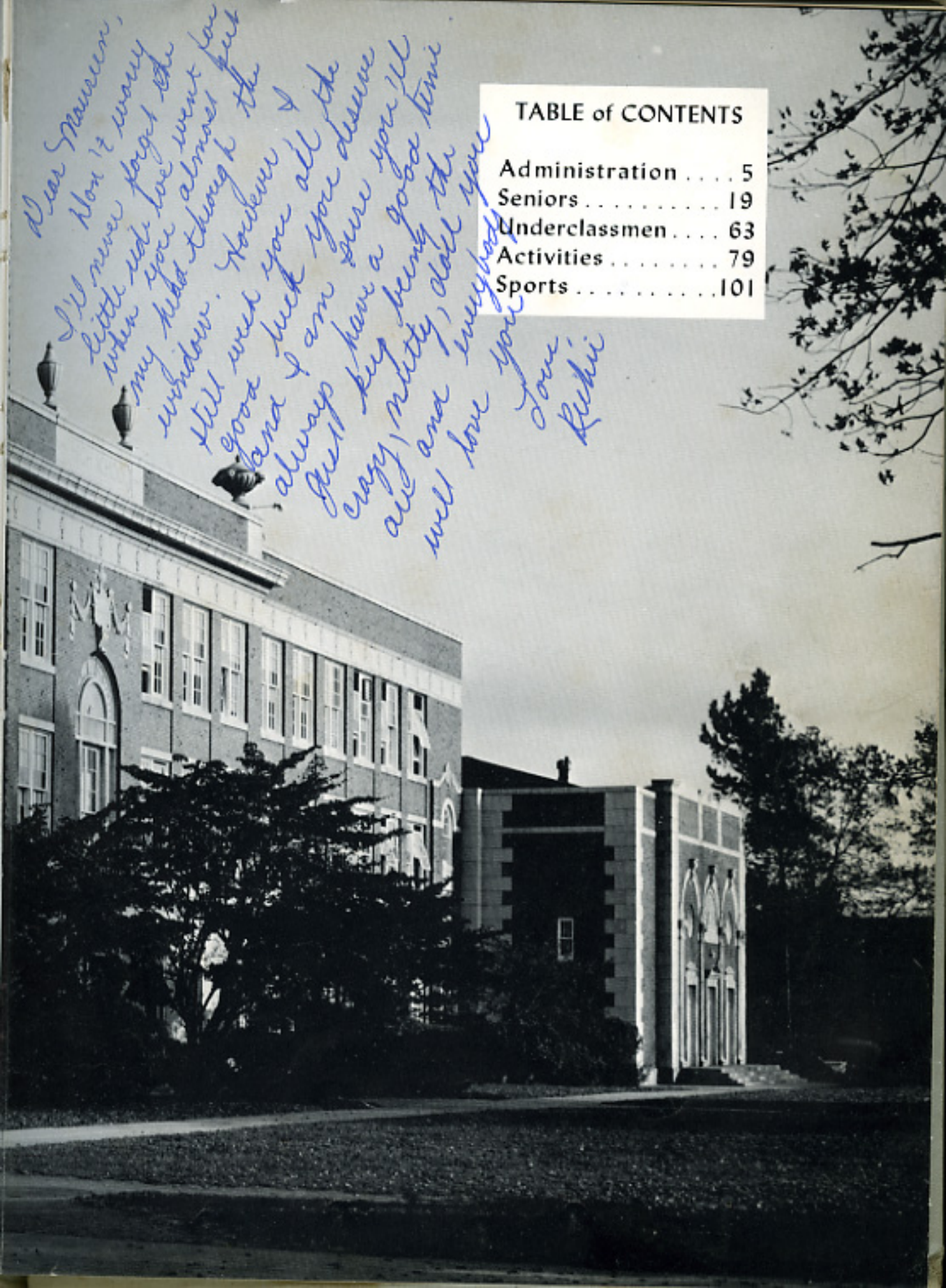

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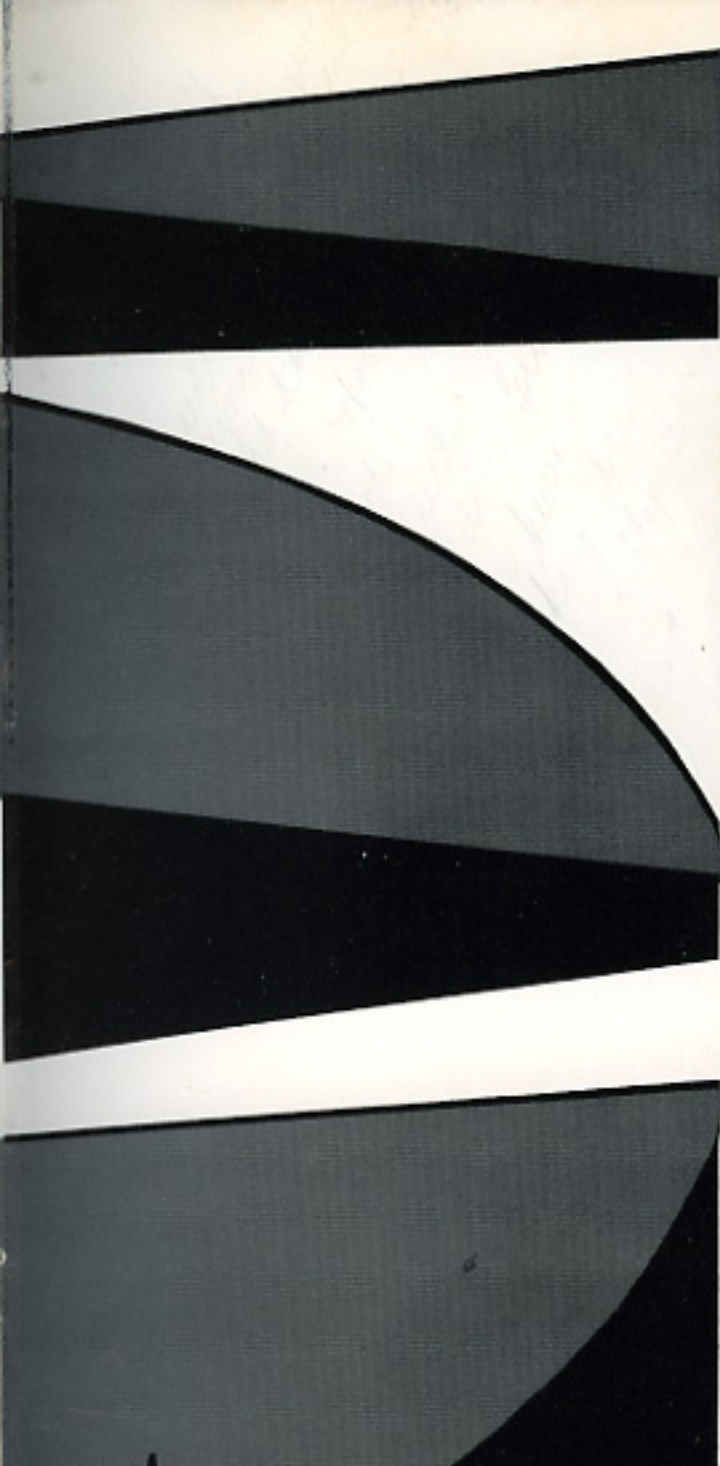




## Foreword

Many people have asked me, "What is the American Field Service?"

A.F.S. began in Paris, in 1914, in the early days of World War I. The American Hospital there offered its services to the French army, and some ambulances were given to it. Later, these ambulances were grouped together and sent to serve on the northern front. When World Wars I and II were over, A.F.S. decided to continue creating personal contacts by bringing foreign students to the United States. At first they brought college and university students. But in 1948, it was suggested that perhaps younger people could create a spirit of understanding as well. A.F.S. decided to bring over a small number of high school students to see what would happen.

And this is what happened. . . . This year, we number 2,229 students from forty-nine different countries who are visiting in the United States.

I want to thank the A.F.S. very much for the terrific year they are giving me in America. I really have had a great time in Mineola, and for me, it is wonderfully interesting to live with other people, to adapt myself to another family, to meet new friends and, above all, to live another kind of life.

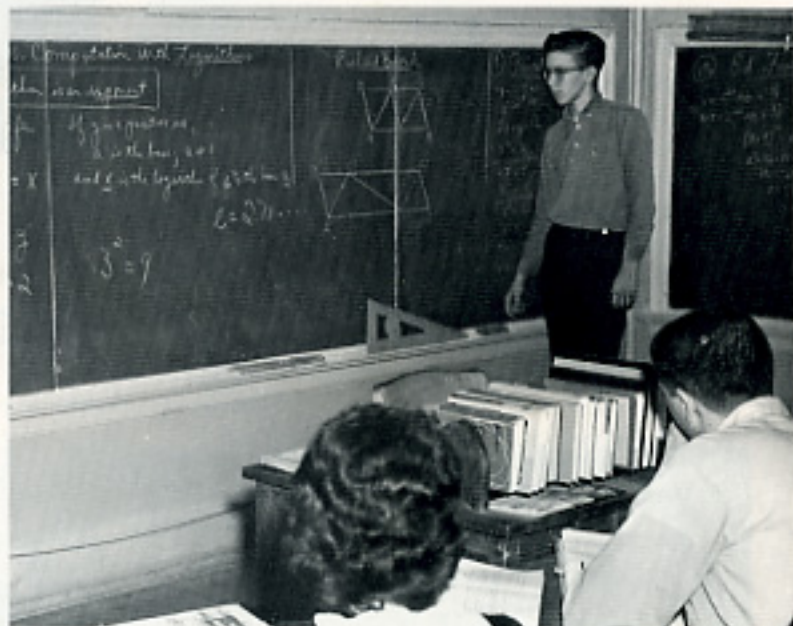

## Special



Special math courses are offered in each of the four years. Freshmen in accelerated classes cover the regular course in elementary algebra and as much intermediate work as time allows. The Special Math 10 and 11 courses also cover the syllabus in their respective subjects and move into more advanced work graded to the ability of the group. Senior classes cover logic, Boolean algebra, and calculus, in addition to the required subjects.



Physiology is an advanced course in biology which explores more thoroughly the study of organisms. Frogs serve as the "guinea pigs" in the numerous and interesting experiments performed. Instruments such as the kymograph and inductorium give the student a chance to work with intricate equipment which is of special value to those entering the more technical fields of science.



## Courses



Honors English courses are open to Seniors selected on the basis of ability and achievement in three previous years of English. English IVA, taught by Miss Berbrich, is a survey of literature from Homer to modern writers accompanied by studies of philosophy, logic and allied arts. Mr. Wargo's IVB class is designed to acquaint the student with the works of modern dramatists from Ibsen to such contemporary authors as Arthur Miller and Tennessee Williams.

One of the three vocational courses offered at Mineola High is auto mechanics. Here students are trained for the automotive industry, where there is an increasing demand for skilled personnel. The curriculum embraces the repairing, maintenance and testing of the engine's clutch, transmission, and brakes. Shop safety is also included in the course.





## Developing Poise and Leadership



Improving self expression, gaining poise, and increasing logical reasoning are goals of the Debating Club. In previous years the club has competed in interscholastic debating contests, but because of the difficulty of split sessions, this year's members are concentrating on building up a strong team for next year. 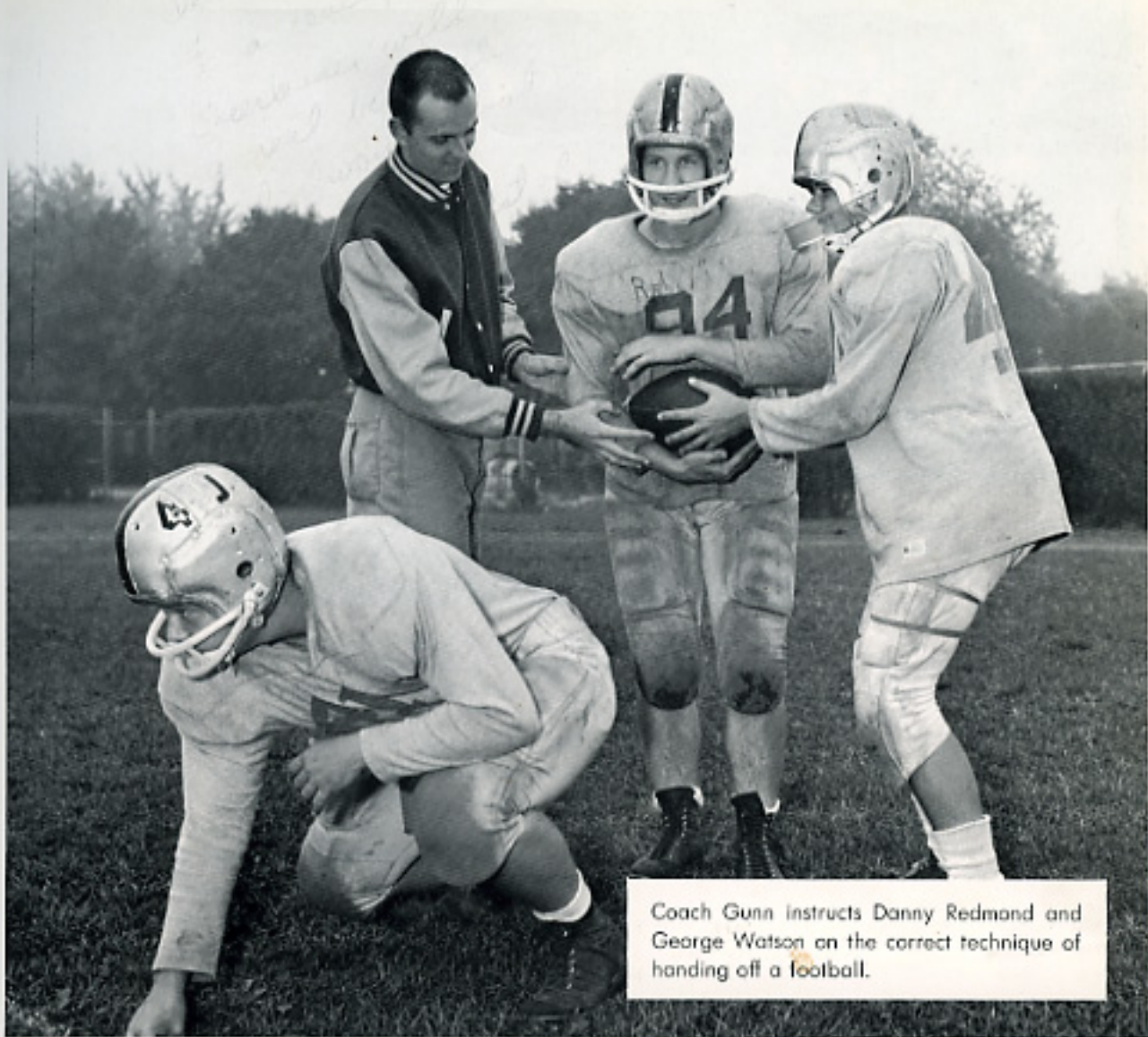

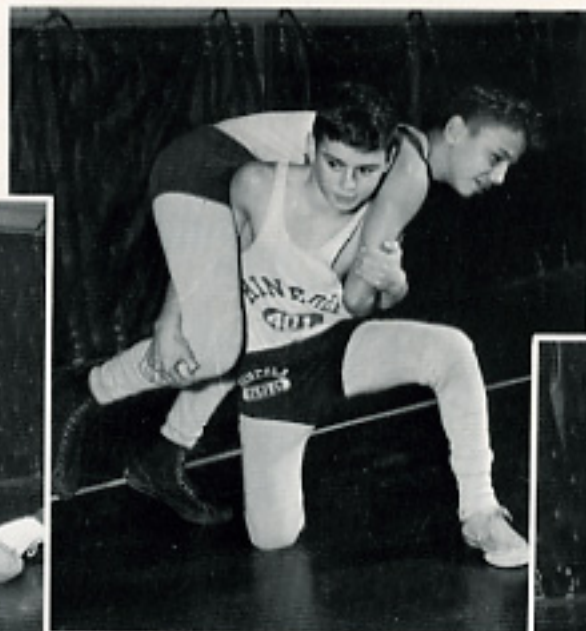

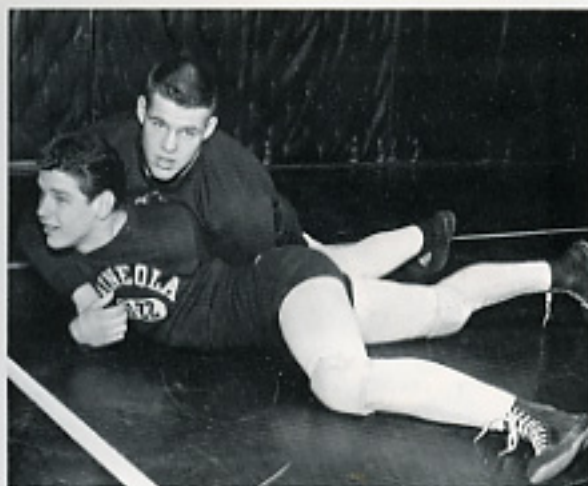
