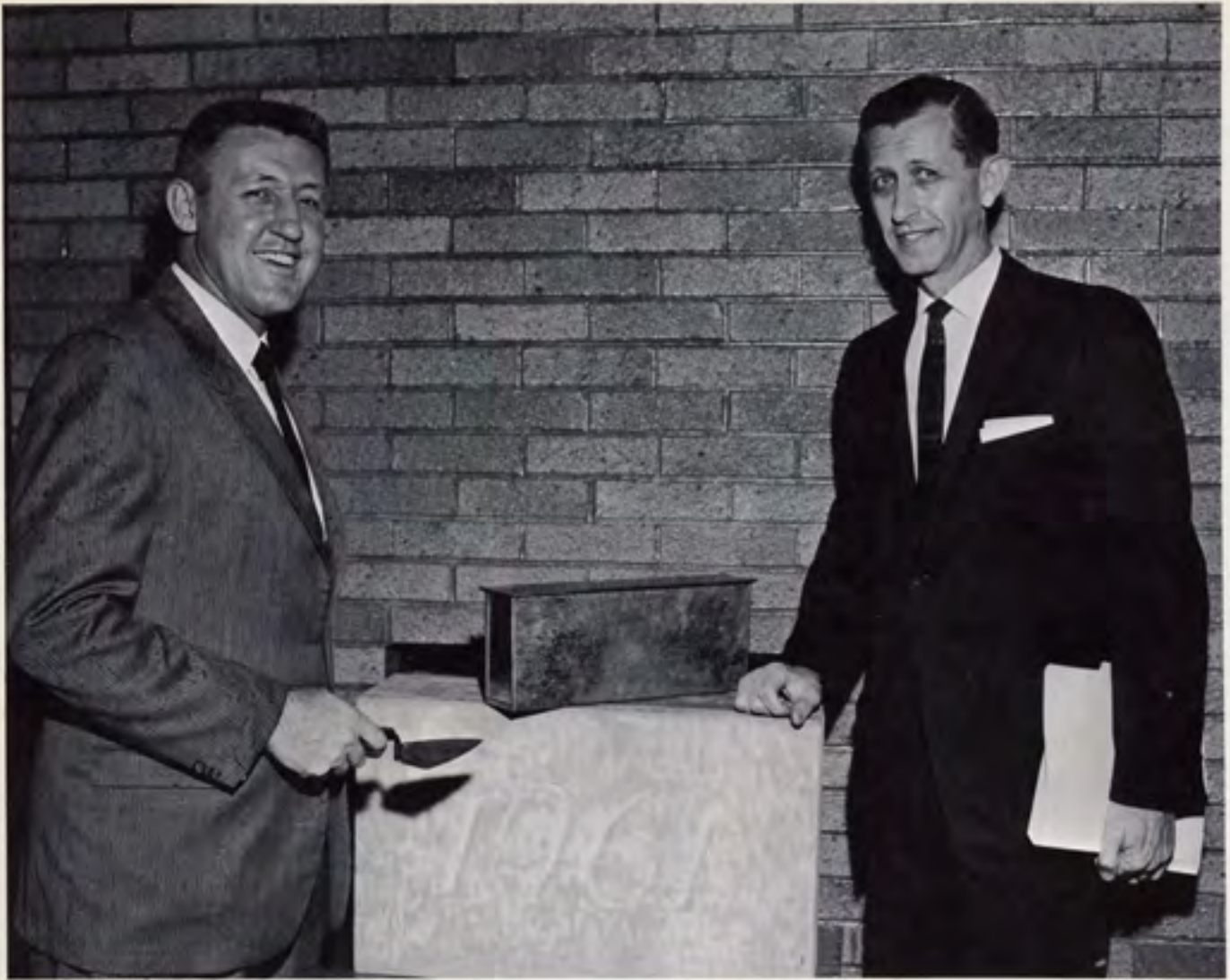


December 15, 1961 — The school begins to take shape as blueprints are cemented into reality — a concrete view.

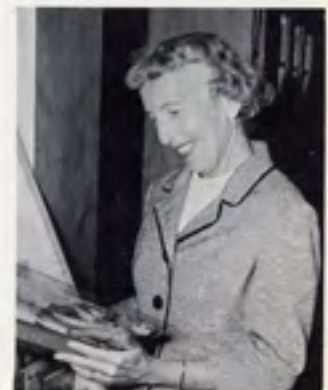

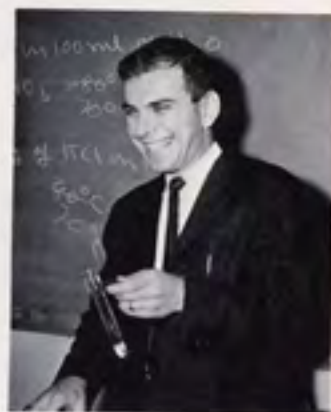

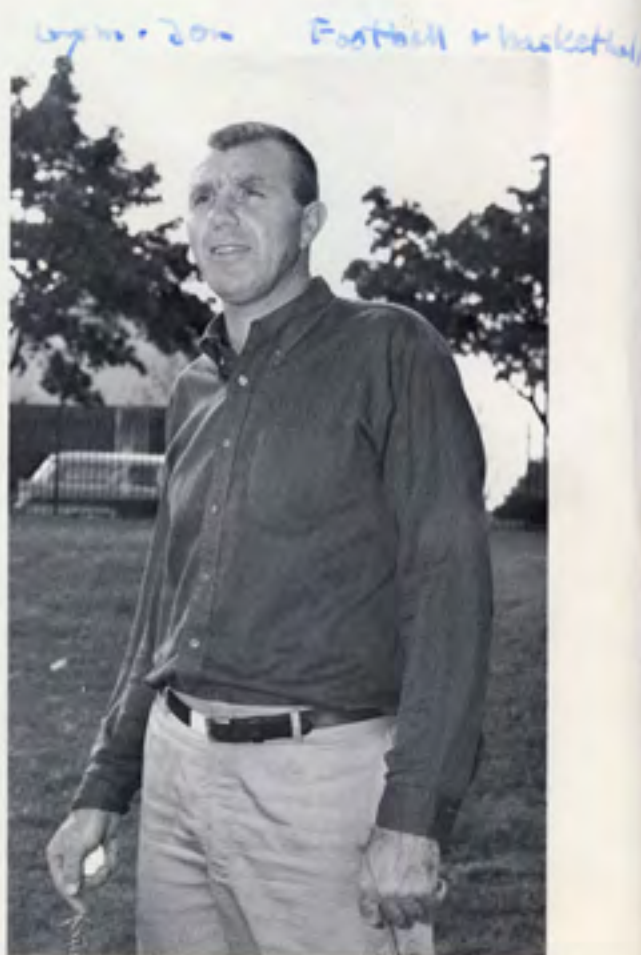

The Chess Club is composed of students interested in the ancient art of chess. At their meetings the members play each other and, on occasion, against other schools.

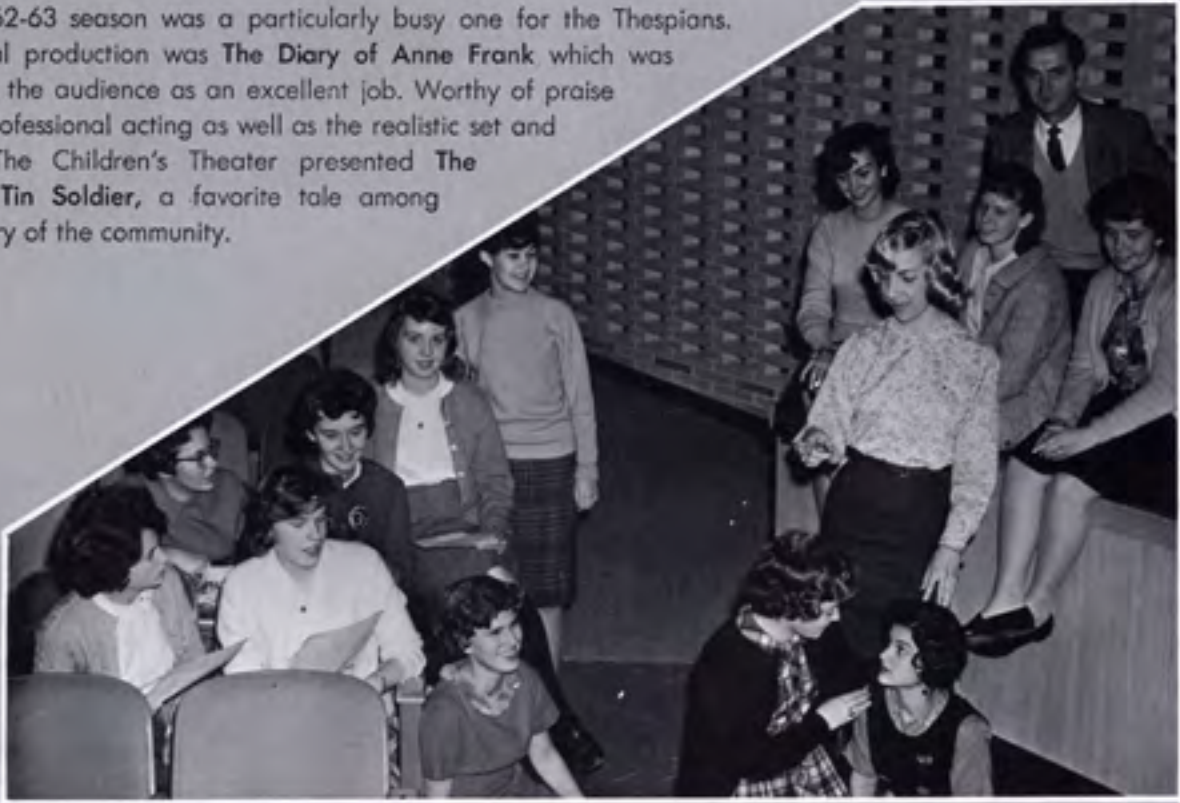



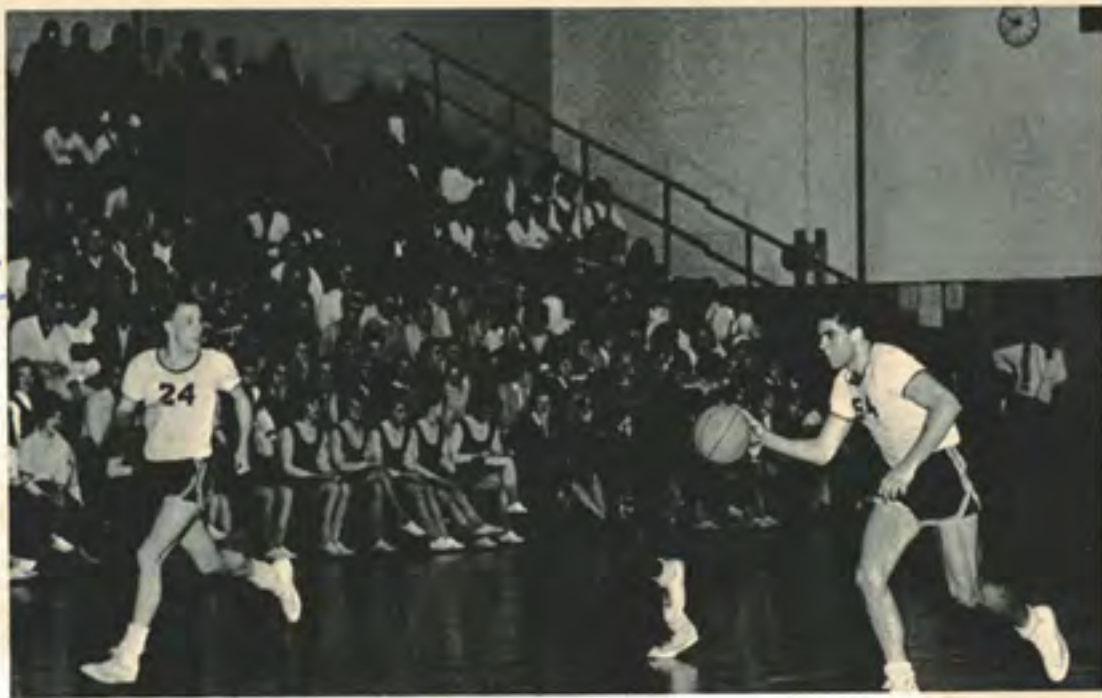
