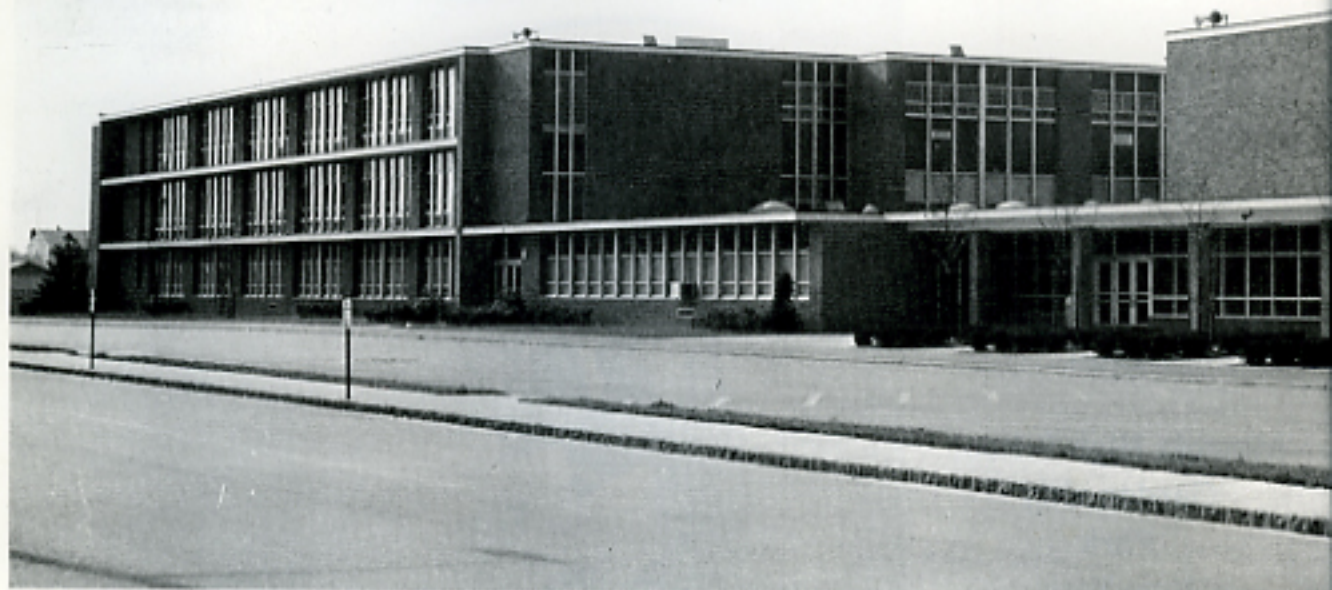


NEW PERSPECTIVES

All in all, 1963-1964 was a year of varied experiences. Social and serious, great and small, they all contributed to the development of our personalities.



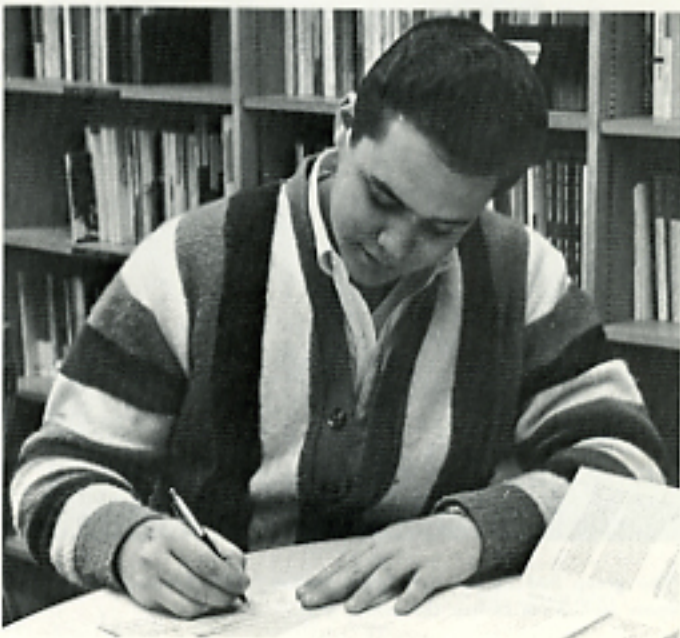

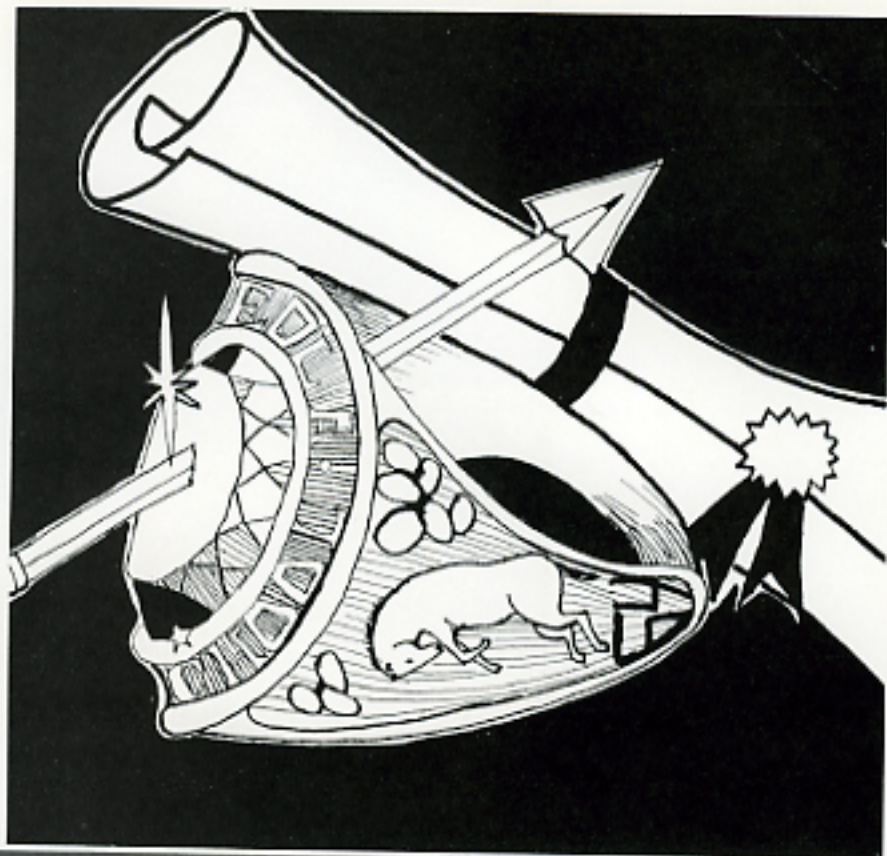

Susan's Summer in Turkey

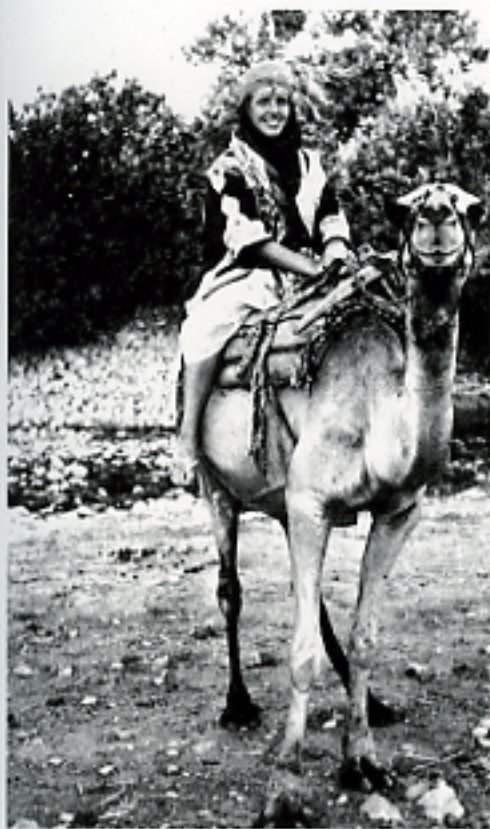
"Hos Geldinez," meaning "a warm welcome" in Turkish, was just what I received when I arrived in Diyarbakir, Turkey. Diyarbakir, the oldest city in Turkey, is surrounded by a massive city-wall. There I led a very sheltered and provincial life. The customs of generations ago are still deep-rooted in Turkish culture, and children have a great respect for their parents and elders. Dating is not yet accepted as a social institution, and visiting friends and relatives was our main recreation.

After six weeks in Diyarbakir, I was sent to Istanbul to get a comparison between the "old and the new" in Turkey. Istanbul is a beautiful city overlooking the flowing Bosphorus, which separates Istanbul into two continents, Asia and Europe. As a conclusion to our visit, all seventy-two A.F.S. representatives in Turkey were given a whirlwind tour of Izmir and Ephesus, where we visited ancient ruins, the tomb of St. John, and the final home of the Virgin Mary.

The A.F.S. has a motto — "Walk together, talk together, ye peoples of the earth. Then, and only then shall ye have peace." I've walked with Turks, talked with Turks, and my heart is at peace with the Turks. Not until you have an opportunity to travel, do you realize how very much alike all people are.

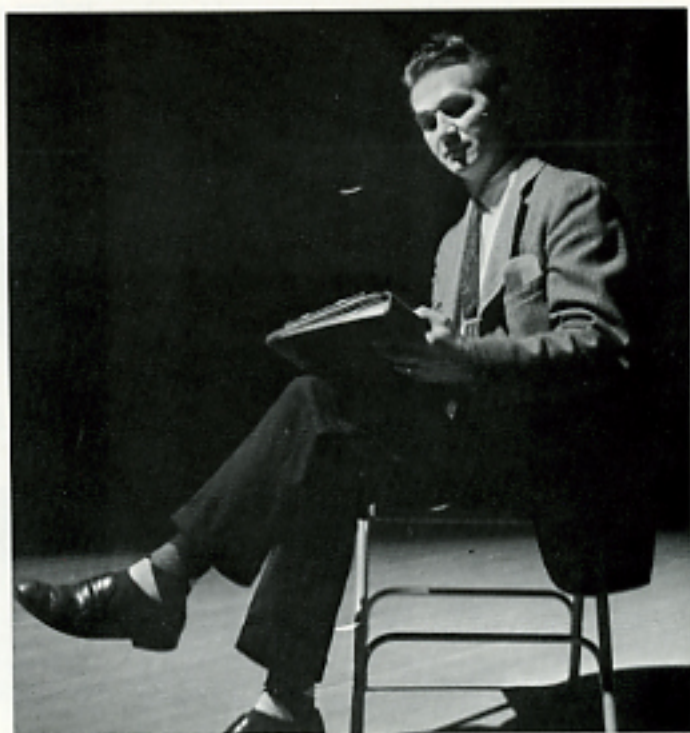

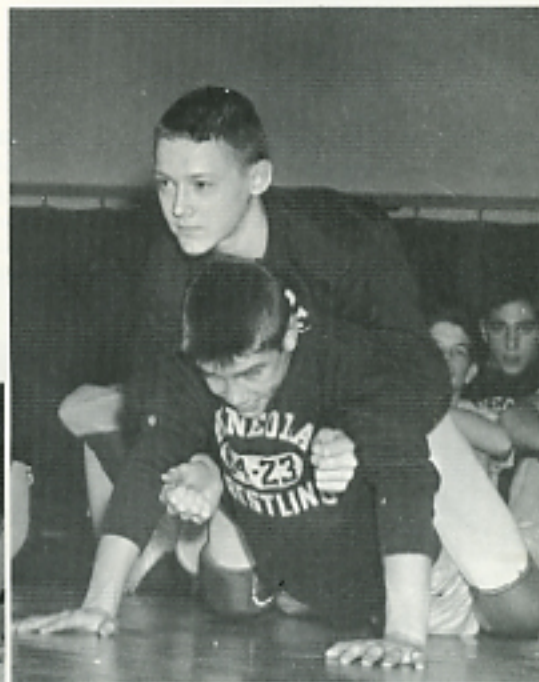

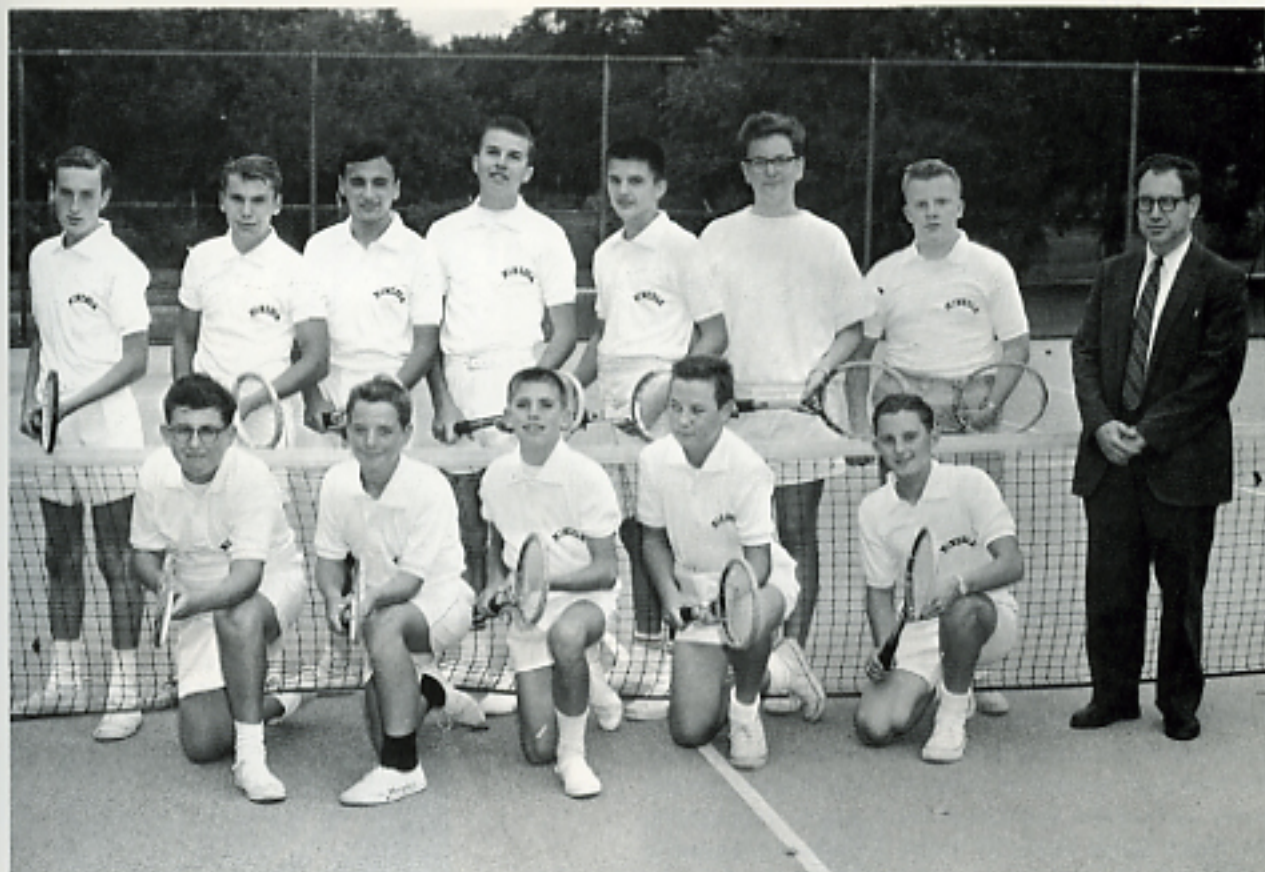

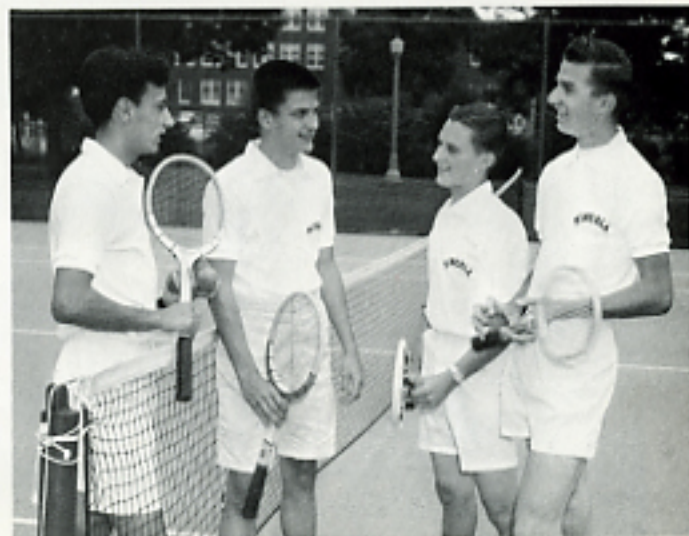

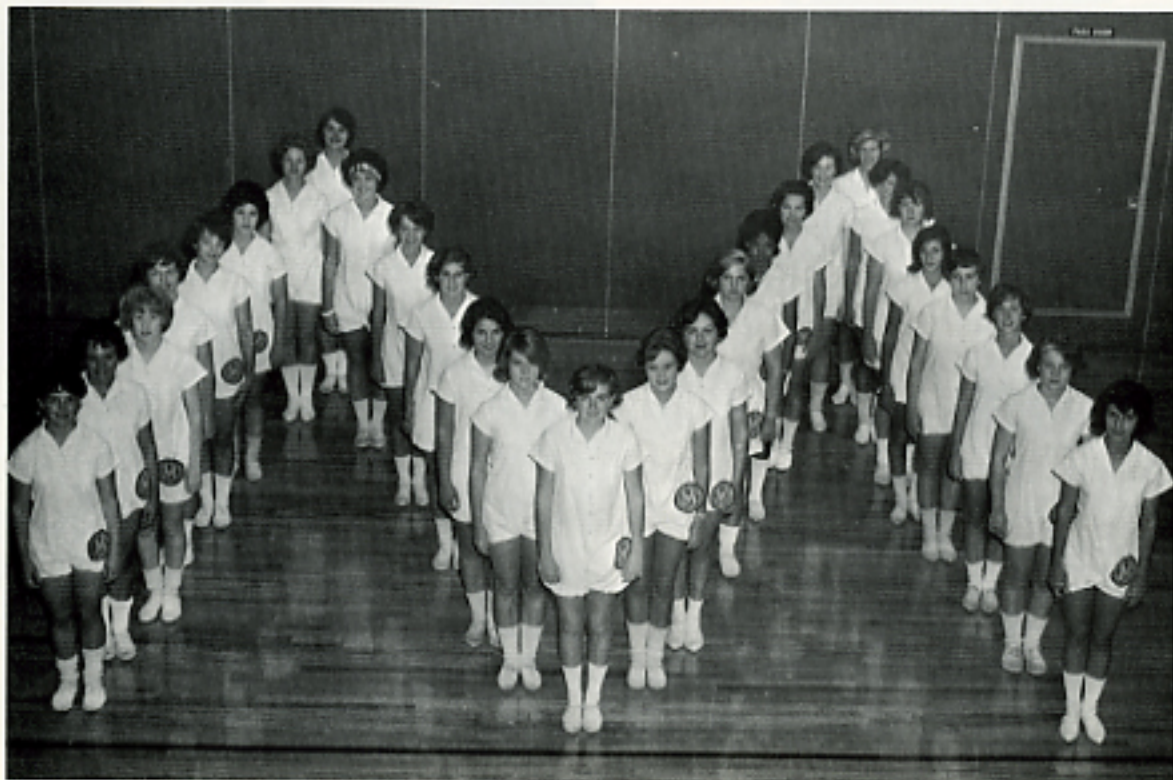
The significance of this group lies in its purpose: to further sportsmanship among the students of our high

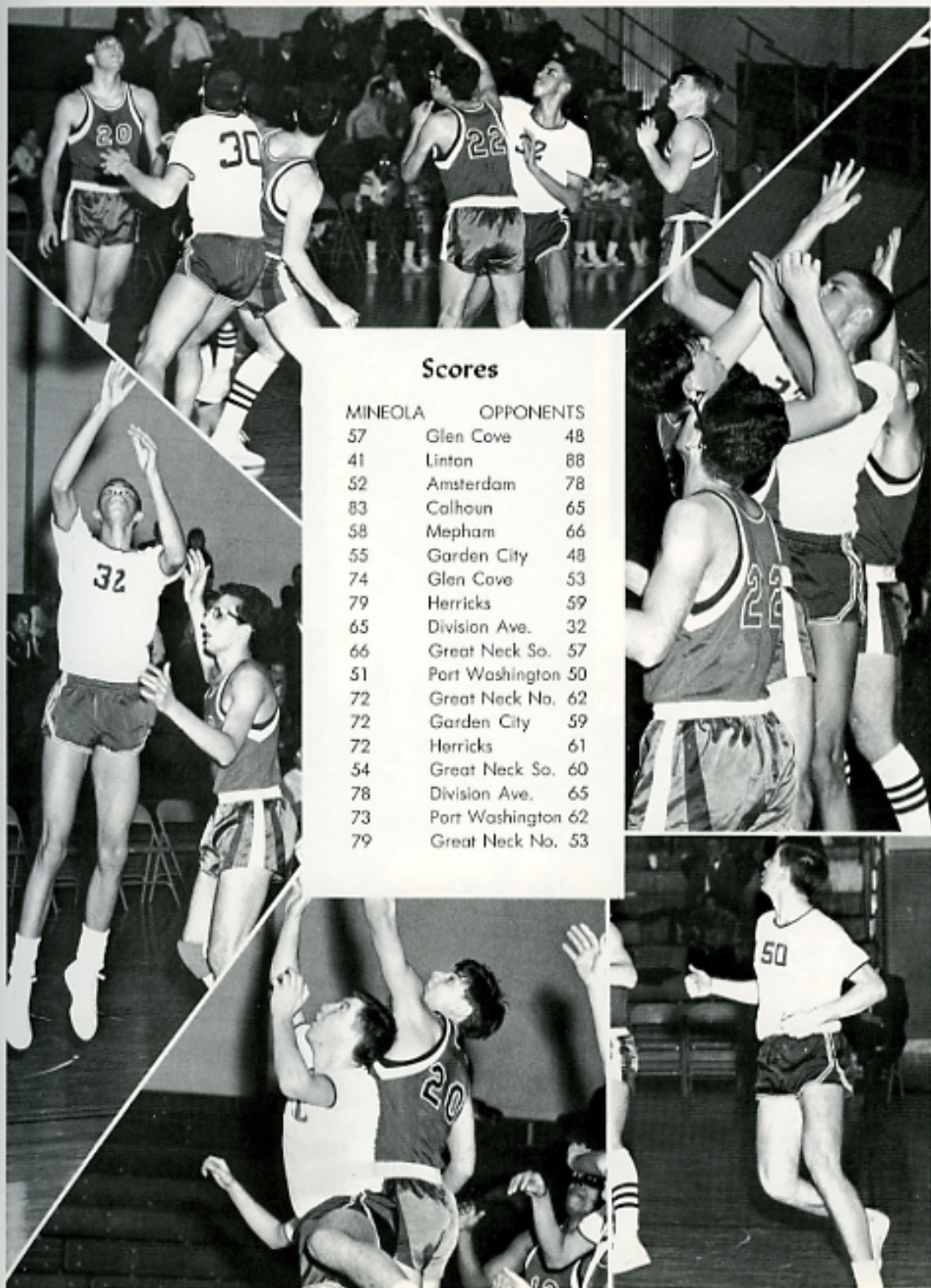

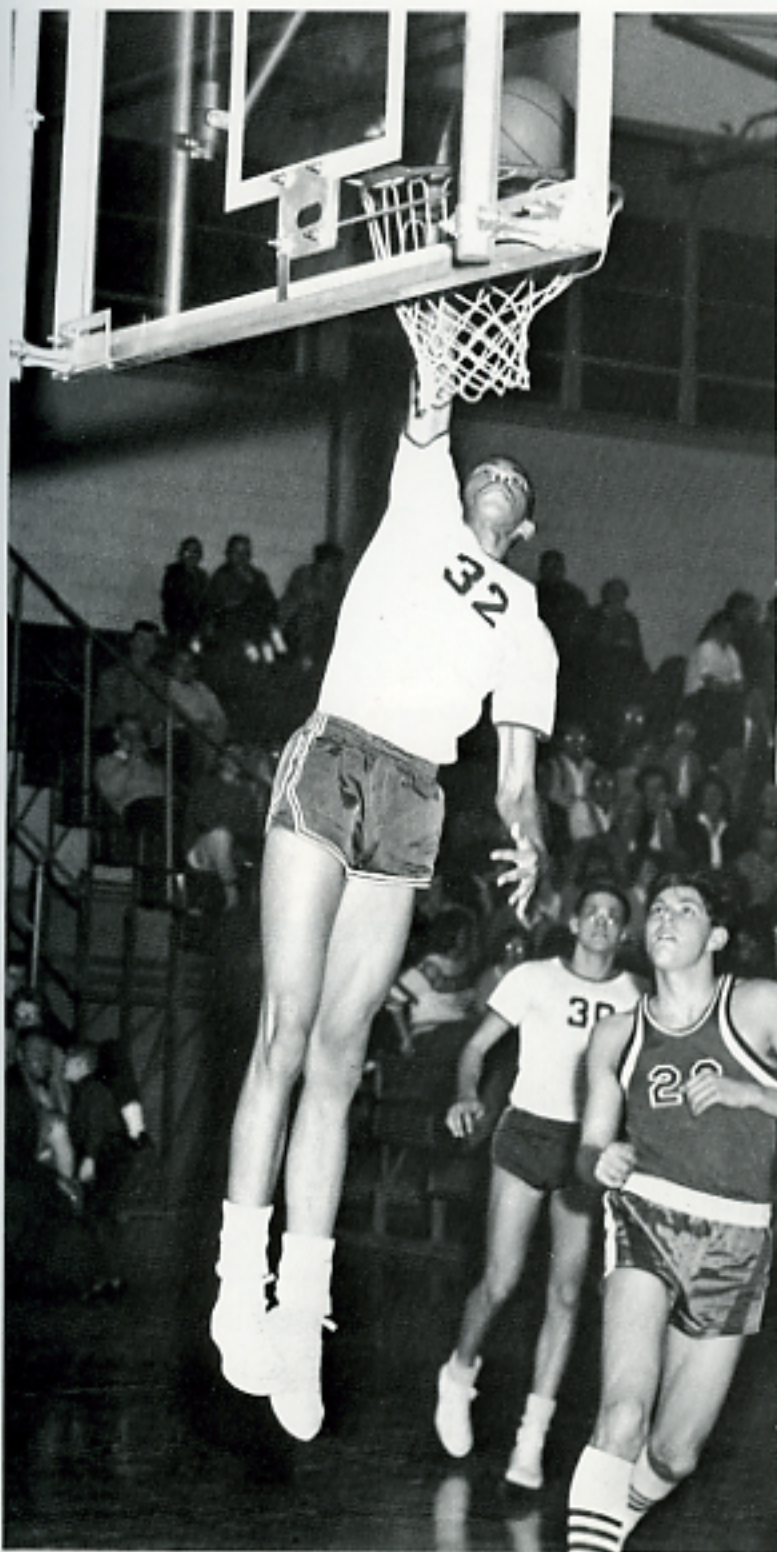

Corley and Szigethy Outstanding Athletes

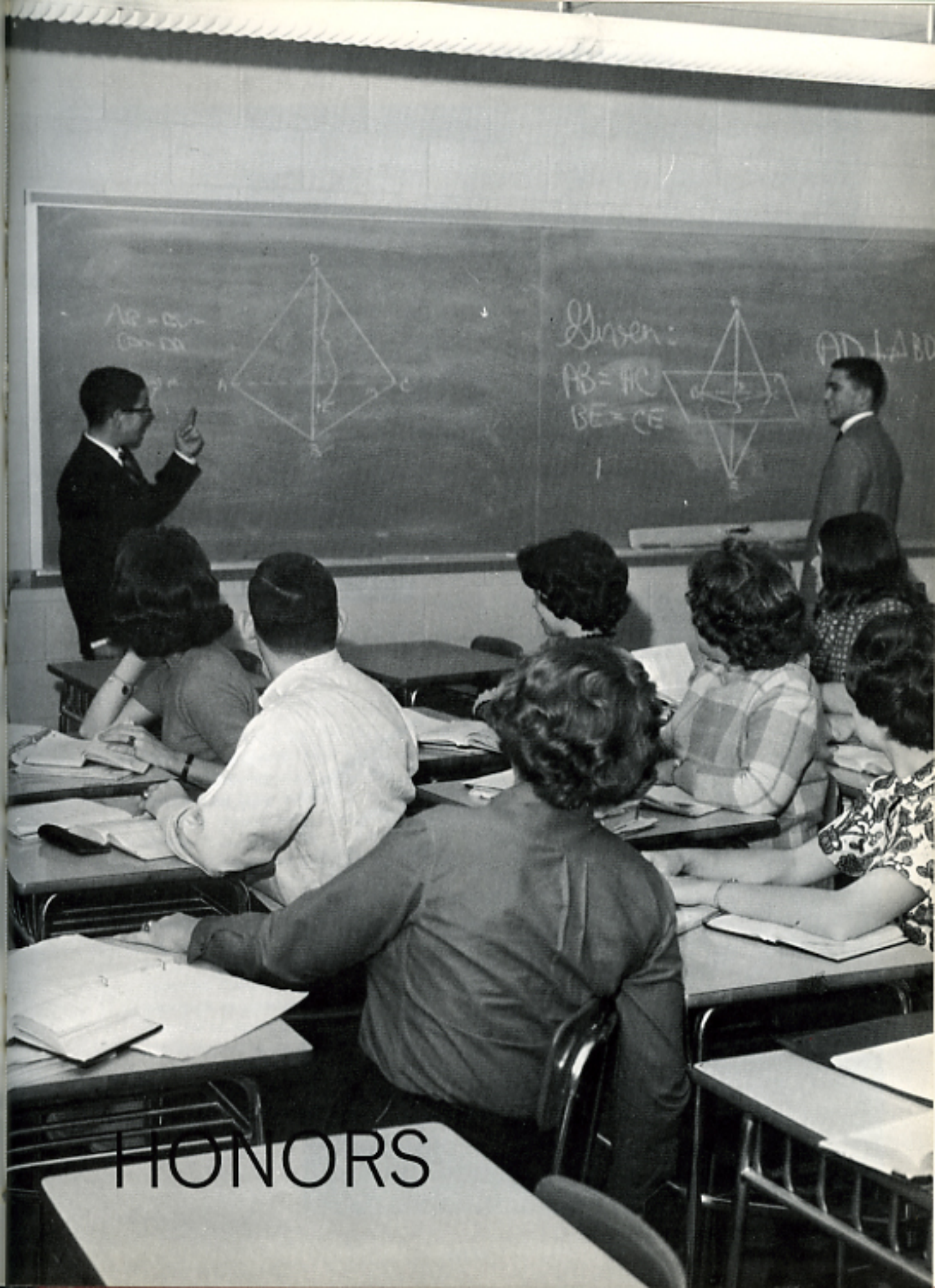

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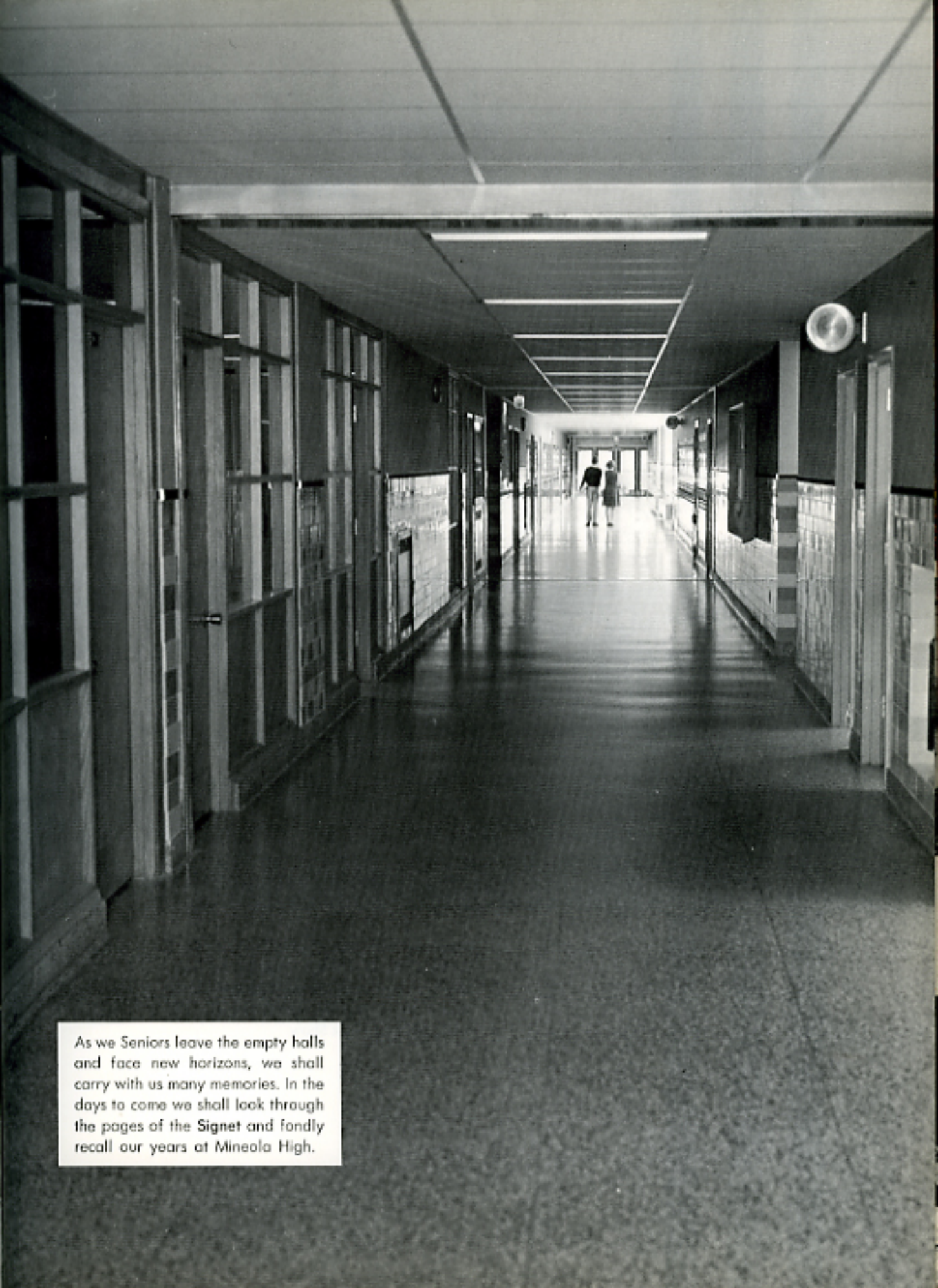
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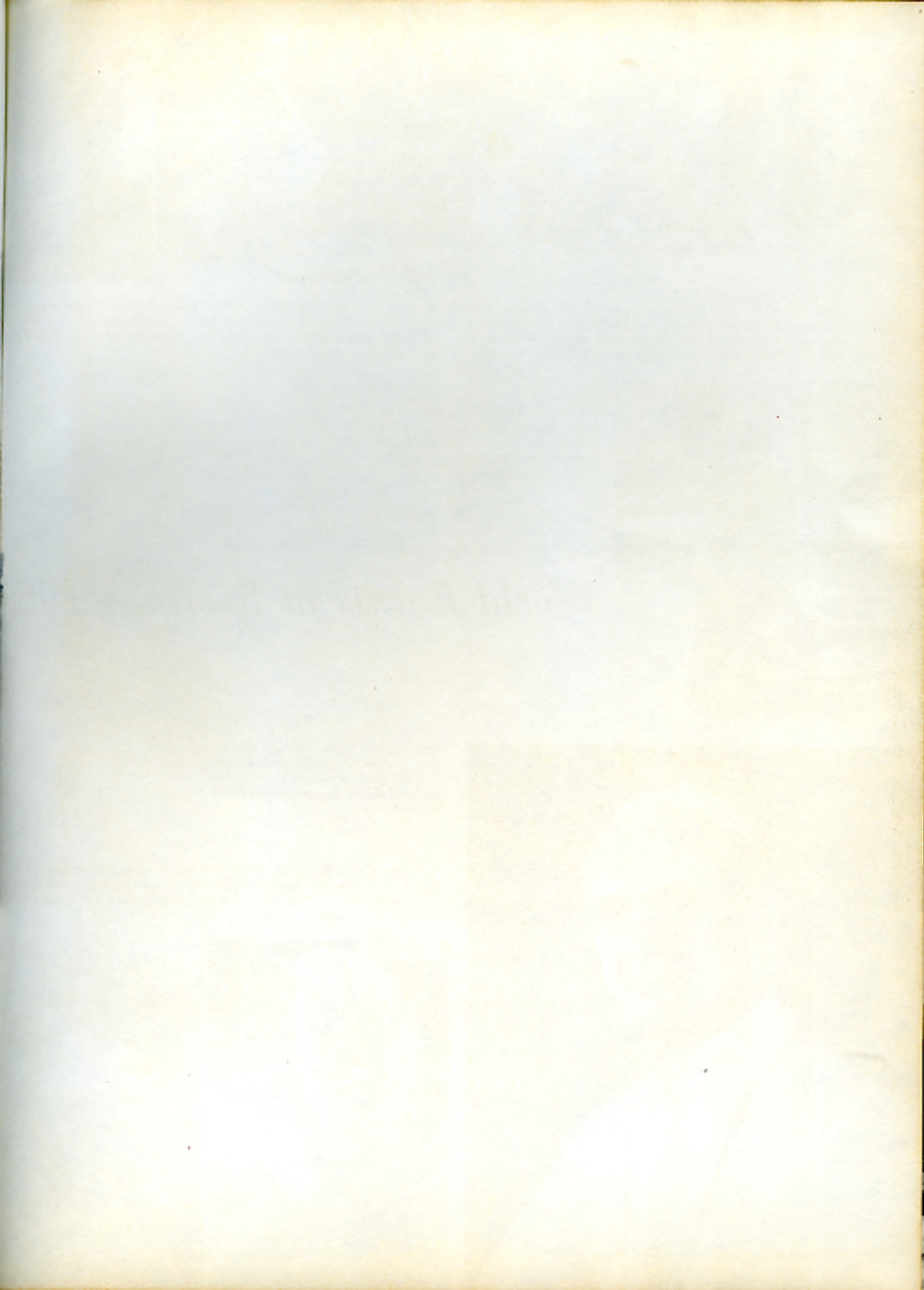

World Events in Review—1963



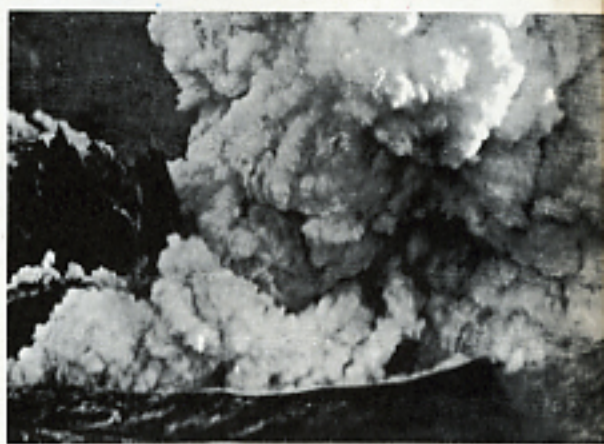
